Monologue 2

Atlantic puffins are sea birds. They are a similar color to penguins, but they have a colorful beak, the outer part of the bird's mouth, which is why some people call them the "sea parrot." The beak fades to a gray color during the winter and becomes colorful again in the spring, suggesting that this colorful beak may make them attractive to other puffins.

Puffins live most of their lives at sea and they rest on the waves when they are not swimming. They are excellent swimmers that use their wings to make a flying movement underwater. Their webbed feet help them to change directions. They can dive to depths of 60 meters; however, they usually stay underwater for only 20 or 30 seconds.

Puffins hunt different kinds of small fish like herring or sand eels. In the air, puffins are surprisingly fast flyers. By flapping their wings up to 400 times per minute they can fly about 90 kilometers an hour.
